

1. Situation. Since 2006 the Kentucky Division has functioned operationally with seven Brigades: Purchase, Western, River Region, Bluegrass, South Central, Big Sandy and Cumberland. Due to the lack of established Camps in certain areas it has become necessary to combine some Brigades. Brigade Commanders are tasked by our Constitution with assistance and support of Camps within their geographic area.

2. Mission. Effective 22 June 2019, The Kentucky Division is divided into six Brigades. Brigade Commanders were elected where possible at the 2019 Kentucky Division Reunion. Those Brigades that a Commander was not elected at that Reunion will be appointed by the Division Commander as needed.

3. Execution.

- The Purchase Brigade will consist of Ballard, Caldwell, Calloway, Carlisle, Crittenden, Fulton, Graves, Hickman, Livingston, Lyon, Marshall, McCracken and Trigg Counties.
- The Western Brigade will consist of Breckinridge, Butler, Christian, Daviess, Edmonson, Grayson, Hancock, Henderson, Hopkins, Logan, McLean, Muhlenberg, Ohio, Simpson, Todd, Union, Warren and Webster Counties.
- The Bluegrass Brigade will consist of Anderson, Boone, Bourbon, Bracken, Bulitt, Campbell, Carroll, Clark, Fayette, Fleming, Franklin, Gallatin, Grant, Hardin, Harrison, Henry, Jefferson, Jessamine, Kenton, Meade, Mercer, Nelson, Nicholas, Oldham, Owen, Pendleton, Robertson, Scott, Shelby, Spencer, Trimble, Washington and Woodford Counties.
- The South-Central Brigade shall consist of Adair, Allen, Barren, Boyle, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Garrard, Green, Hart, Larue, Lincoln, Madison, Marion, McCreary, Metcalf, Monroe, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Russell, Taylor and Wayne Counties.
- The Big Sandy Brigade will consist of Bath, Boyd, Carter, Elliott, Estill, Floyd, Greenup, Johnson, Lawrence, Lewis, Magoffin, Martin, Mason, Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, Powell, Rowan and Wolfe Counties.
- The Cumberland Brigade will consist of Bell, Breathitt, Clay, Harlan, Jackson, Knott, Knox, Laurel, Lee, Leslie, Letcher, Owsley, Perry, Pike and Whitley Counties.

4. Coordinating Instructions.

1. Brigade Commanders are tasked to locate and communicate as quickly as possible with Commanders or Adjutants of all active Camps in their Brigade Area.
2. The importance of Brigade meetings on a quarterly or semi-annual basis cannot be over-emphasized.
